The superb quality of the waters around Ibiza and Formentera, so turquoise and crystal clear, is thanks to the presence of the largest underwater meadows of Posidonia Oceánica or Neptune Grass in the Mediterranean, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1999.

Neptune Grass is endemic to the Mediterranean Sea. Although it lives in the water, it's not seaweed but a true plant with roots, stems and leaves. Its presence is of vital importance because of the valuable role it plays in filtering sediment, making the water exceptionally clear and ensuring the quality and oxygenation of an underwater ecosystem where hundreds of species of marine plants and animals feed and reproduce. Once the Neptune Grass has bloomed, its debris creates reefs outside the water that run parallel to the coast, protecting it from erosion by acting as a breakwater. It therefore maintains the coastal balance and helps the fine sand to settle, forming our beaches and dunes.







Another outstanding animal species is the Ibiza wall lizard (*Podarcis Pityusensis*). Endemic to these islands, there are several dozen different subspecies with a huge range of colours from brown to blue. Formentera's lizards aren't afraid of humans and they fearlessly populate the most arid and barren landscapes. Other outstanding island fauna includes the garden dormouse (*Eliomys Quercinus*) and several endemic species of snails and beetles.

## THE SALT MARSH NATURAL PARK OF SES SALINES

This Park is a wonderful example of the wealth of Mediterranean biodiversity. It provides a unique nesting and resting area for migrating birds. As a natural area of special interest, it includes a range of terrestrial and marine habitats of great interest in terms of their ecology, landscape, history and also culture.

### FLORA AND FAUNA

The Park is home to wonderful examples of most of the plant species found on the *Islas Pitiusas* or "pine islands". Plant life on Formentera is predominated by coastal pine woods and juniper and the flora surrounding its lagoons, dune systems and cliffs, covered by thriving communities of sea fennel. Also typical are the many zones with mobile and semi-mobile dunes.

Some 210 species of bird have been registered in the Natural Park, especially populations of waterfowl such as the flamingo, black-winged stilt, common shelduck, Kentish plover and other seabirds such as Audouin's gull and the Balearic shearwater. One of the largest concentrations of black-necked grebes in Europe can be found in the Estany Pudent.







### The Es Freus Marine Reserve of lbiza and Formentera was created in 1999 with the objective of protecting ecosystems, stopping the deterioration of habitats and recovering and repopulating threatened species and areas.

## ES FREUS MARINE RESERVE



It's located between the islands of Ibiza and Formentera and encompasses the southern and northem ends of Ibiza, the west of Formentera and the area between them. This strip of water is dotted with small islets such as Porcs, Penjats, Espalmador and Castaví, the remains of a geological past when both islands were joined together. The boundaries of the Es Freus Marine Reserve were extended in 2015. It now covers an area of 13,617 marine hectares and is the second largest protected marine area in the Spanish Mediterranean after the Migjorn Reserve of Mallorca. It ranges from shallow zones up to depths of more than 60 metres and is home to a wide variety of underwater landscapes, particularly the Neptune Grass meadows declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.





## WORLD HERITAGE



### DALT VILA

This is the old town of Ibiza, declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1999. Surrounded by impressive walls, it serves as a lookout point for most of the island, including Formentera.



### SA CALETA PHOENICIAN SETTLEMENT

A Phoenician jetty, still in use. It dates back to the end of the 8th century BC although it may have been used early as a seasonal base for expeditions from the south of the Iberian Peninsula.

















Majorca is a land of olive trees and windmills, fun and relaxation, and most of all of the best and most beautiful beaches in the Mediterranean. Every year, Majorca is chosen as the top destination for tourists, keeping its charm intact.

In Majorca's coves and beaches, time seems to come to a stop. Es Trenc, Cala Domingos, Cala Mondragó and Cala Mandía are some of the beaches waiting for you to discover them. Each of them offers the possibility of giving in to relaxation and rest while gazing at the Mediterranean. Thanks to its thousand-year-old history, Majorca has summer celebrations and many secrets to be revealed; the island is a treasure chest full of charms you will soon discover. As well as its beaches, Majorca's visitors can leave the island with a suitcase full of memories of spots of great interest like the Palma Cathedral, the Bellver Castle, Formentor, the Drach Caves and Sa Calobra.











### • Cape of Formentor.

The impressive cliffs of Cabo de Formentor represent one of the most typical pictures of the island. It is a viewpoint spread over several kilometres that mixes imposing views of the Mediterranean and Menorca with a stunning beach surrounded by pines trees.

- Palma, the Ciutat de Mallorca. It has a beautiful old town with stately courtyards, charming streets, modernist buildings and its majestic Cathedral that overlooks the sea.
- Towns of Majorca. The island of Majorca is full of villages that bring us back to the olden days like Banyalbufar, Fornalutx, Sóller, Alcudia, Valldemosa and Deià. In them you can enjoy the local character of Majorca.
- Serra de Tramuntana. The mountains of Majorca were declared Cultural Heritage of Humanity by Unesco for the beauty of its crops and water distribution mechanisms.
- Caves. Majorca has an exceptional underground landscape due to its calcareous nature. The most well known caves are the caves of the Drach, Campanet and Artà, all very close to the Insotel Cala Mandia Resort & Spa.














- Sports for all. Hiking through Mondragó Park, cycling routes all over the island, golf by the sea, psicobloc in Cala Varques ... and of course diving, snorkeling, kayaking, sailing, stand up paddle boarding and other water sports all in the Mediterranean Sea.
- Aquarium. An aquarium that recreates marine habitats and ecosystems in 55 tanks containing a total of 5 million litres of seawater and more than 700 species of turtles, sharks, moray eels, seahorses, rays...
- Natura Parc. A park with an area of 30,000 m<sup>2</sup>, that brings children closer to the ecological reality of Majorca and its indigenous animals.
- Train to Sóller. Since 1912 the Soller Railroad has united Palma with Sóller along with its famous wooden train. Travel among orange, olive and almond trees, through stunning scenery.
- Waterparks. Majorca offers fantastic ways to spend a day at the water slides, swimming pools and attractions. The best-known water parks are Aqualand Aquacity, Aqualand Aquapark and Hidropark.
- **Popular markets.** We recommend the urban markets of Santa Catalina and l'Olivar in Palma. But do not forget the craftwork of Binissalem, the surprising purchases in Consell and fruits and vegetables in Santa María ...
- **Delicious cuisine.** The cuisine of Majorca allows you to taste many local specialties. The most well known are sobrasada and ensaimada, but we also recommend pa amb oli, trampó, lechona and a magnificent bakery.















Welcome to Menorca and its 216 kilometres of coast, where you can admire green fields, the gorgeous blue of its Mediterranean waters and its charming whitewashed houses. Menorca's great ecological and landscape richness makes it the Mediterrean's most attractive natural destination. Proof of this is that the island was declared a Biosphere Reserve by the Unesco.

### PLACES OF INTEREST

Small in size but big when it comes to tourist attractions, Menorca has a large number of interesting places to visit:

- Mahón. The capital of the island that does not possess the tranquillity that characterises Menorca. It is home to the second largest natural port in Europe, 6 kilometres long and the perfect place to taste the delicious gastronomy menorquina.
- Ciutadella. It is unthinkable to visit Menorca and not to walk the streets and squares in the historical centre of Ciutadella, full of charming corners and a beautiful port where you can also indulge yourself in gastronomy.
- Punta Prima. In addition to the beautiful beach, Punta Prima has a coastal defence tower built at the end of the XVIII, the Tower of Son Ganxo, with beautiful views over the island and its well-known lighthouse.
- Naveta des Tudons. Sample the long history of Menorca, this prehistoric funerary monument built around 1000 BC. It is probably the most visited point on Menorca. It is considered the oldest building in Europe.
- S'Albufera des Grau. As Menorca's most important natural park, which is clearly responsible for its designation as a Biosphere Reserve, hundreds of native animal and plant species, especially waterfowl and birds of prey, can be seen in this vast natural expanse.













### **BEACHES**

Menorca is known for the beauty of its crystalline water coves. To the north there are beaches of wilder character, while to the south await beaches more familiar and accessible.

- Punta Prima. Easy access and numerous services, from this beach you can see both the lighthouse of Punta Prima and the islet of Cagaire and Isla del Aire. Ideal for water sports.
- Cala Galdana. With a particularly familiar atmosphere, it is one of the most extensive coves in Menorca.
- **Binigaus.** An example of a virgin beach, Binigaus marks the beginning of the cliffs at the area of the Poniente menorquín and it is common to practice of nudism here.
- Macarella. Picture of some of the most famous postcards of Menorca, in this cove the sea has a particularly intense blue colour, rivalling Cala en Turqueta.

### RECREATIONAL ACTIVITIES

- **Sunsets.** You cannot go to Menorca and not marvel at the incredible sunsets, especially beautiful from the various lighthouses of Favàritx, Punta Nati and Cavalleria.
- **Hiking.** An ancient path of 185 kilometres, the Camí de Cavalls, completely surrounds Menorca. It is ideal for walking, cycling or horseback riding.
- **Diving.** The crystalline waters that surround the island make it the ideal place to practice this sport, which will also allow you to discover the local marine fauna and flora.
- Kayak. This sport, which isn't the most difficult of sports is the perfect way to explore the Bay of Fornells. It will also allow you to enjoy a very special view of Menorca.
- Cycling. The low altitude of Menorca allows you to use the bicycle as much posible.

GASTRONOMY: The red lobster of Menorca and the Mahonés Cheese have its own denomination of origin.

- Pomada: A traditional drink made with the gin Xoriger, and lemonade.
- Sweets: the carguinyols, crespells, panellets and rubiols





These are cold water production plants for air conditioning which make use of the waste heat from cold condensation to produce domestic hot water. In installations without hot air recovery units, this is emitted into the atmosphere and lost. The recovery system therefore results in significant energy savings.





# ENVIRONMENT RECYCLING AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT

Our hotels in Menorca belong to the Sant Lluís Council community of recycled water users and are the major consumers of recycled water in the community, an initiative recognised on World Tourism Day in 2013.

Water consumption totalled 53,560 m<sup>3</sup> in 2016.

These hotels have also been recognised by the association:



Reciclar hoy, construir el mañana.

for recycling **35,000 kg** of glass, becoming the establishments recycling the largest amount of glass in Menorca.

 Our hotels also collaborate with their local residents' associations. For instance, our hotels in Cala Tarida have been involved in monitoring and controlling the yellow seaweed in the bay.

- Insotel Hotel Group uses treated waste water for irrigation at:
  - Insotel Hotel Formentera Playa
  - Insotel Tarida Beach Sensatori Resort
  - Insotel Club Tarida Playa
- Insotel Club Maryland has a desalinisation plant.
- Insotel Tarida Beach Sensatori Resort has osmosis plants.
- We've implemented environmental awareness programmes at our hotels:
  - Our customers are informed that they can reuse towels to reduce water, energy and chemical consumption.
  - Separate bins are provided for cardboard, glass and plastic.
  - Flow reducers have been installed in showers and washbasins.
  - Full and half-flush systems have been installed in cisterns and bathrooms
  - Card keys that turn off the lights and air conditioning.
  - Sensors on doors of terraces and windows that turn off the air conditioning.
- **Bicycle hire** at the hotel establishments of Formentera, Mallorca and Menorca.
- Two charging points in Formentera for electric cars.
- Electric vehicles for our staff involved with technical services, apartments, receptions and discount stores at our hotels in Ibiza. Formentera and Menorca.







At each of its hotels, Insotel Hotel Group is strongly committed to the local community:

Insotel Hotel Group buys locally sourced products from suppliers such as Distribuciones Chico, Gaseosas La Ibicenca and Garu, among others.







- To promote the region's cuisine, our hotels prepare menus using typical products from the Balearic Islands.
- Insotel Punta Prima Resort & Spa collaborates with the "la Caixa" Incorpora programme which promotes the integration of people with difficulties in finding employment.



- In 2014 a children's playground was provided for the residents of Sant Lluís. Punta Prima.
- It also collaborates with the Sant Lluís Council by providing rooms for the organisers of the local saint's day festival.
- It has sponsored the Sant Lluís Cultural and Sports Centre for the 2016 to 2019 seasons.









Insotel Hotel Group realises that it can help others by ensuring good environmental management.

- Insotel Hotel Group has donated furniture, blankets and other domestic goods to:
  - Spanish Red Cross
  - Caritas
  - Queen Sofia Residential Home
- It has also sold furniture, donating the proceeds as follows:
